<p><b>Roll out (something)</b></p>	<p><b>Definition:</b> To Introduce something</p>	<p>Due to restructuring, the company will <i>begin rolling</i> out some new policies this summer. We'll be sure to keep everyone up-to-date</p>
<p><b>Go after (someone/ something)</b></p>	<p><b>Definition:</b> To try to get someone or something; to work to get something. My best advice is to do everything you can to <i>go after</i> the job you want.</p>	<p>Let's do what we can to <i>go after</i> this potential client. This would be a fantastic contract for our company.</p>
<p><b>Get Ahead</b></p>	<p><b>Definition: To make progress</b> I have to make sure I get this project done on time. Maybe I'll stay at work late tonight to <i>get ahead</i>.</p>	<p><b>Definition: To become more successful</b> To get ahead in this industry, you really need to be well-connected. It isn't what you know, it's who you know.</p>
<p><b>Burn Out</b></p>	<p><b>Definition:</b> To cause to fail, wear out, or become exhausted due to overwork.</p>	<p>Did you hear Sara quit her job? I guess she was just really <i>burnt out</i> after working 12-hour days every day. I can't blame her. That's just too much!</p>
<p><b>Zero in on (something)</b></p>	<p><b>Definition: To discover, pinpoint</b> I think I've <i>zeroed in</i> on the problem. It took quite a bit of work, but I found the issue.</p>	<p><b>Definition: To direct all of one's attention to someone or something.</b> Okay, let's zero in on this project. We're running out of time, and this is the most important for our long-term success</p>
<p><b>Put off (something)</b></p>	<p><b>Definition:</b> To postpone; to hold off</p>	<p>Do you <i>put off</i> unpleasant tasks until the last minute at the end of the day?</p>
<p><b>Spell (something) out</b></p>	<p><b>Definition:</b> To make something plain and simple. To explain something in a detailed way so it is clear or easy to understand</p>	<p>Lara, thanks for coming in to talk more about this. We're interested in your proposal, but we'd like to have you <i>spell a few things out for us</i>.</p>
<p><b>Think through</b></p>	<p><b>Definition:</b> To think carefully about; to think about all the different parts or aspects of something to fully understand it.</p>	<p>You've certainly given us something to <i>think through</i>. We will consider this proposal carefully and get back to you in a few days.</p>
<p><b>Go over (something)</b></p>	<p><b>Definition:</b> To review.</p>	<p>Let's go over the agenda for today's meeting. I want to make sure we don't forget anything important as we have a lot to discuss today.</p>
<p><b>Call off (something)</b></p>	<p><b>Definition:</b> To cancel</p>	<p>The boss <i>called off</i> the meeting today. Sounds like there is some emergency that came up – I hope everything is okay.</p>
