


Erick Chavez, Highland Park High School, is the IHSA FIFA eSports State Champion.

## **Facilities**

#### **Boilers at DHS**

Improvements to HVAC infrastructure include replacing two of the original boilers installed when Deerfield High School was built in 1960. A third boiler, which was installed in 2002, is also being replaced. All three units are past their useful lifespan. They will be replaced by smaller and more energy-efficient units that are more cost effective to run and less costly to repair.







## **Regarding Roof Work in Highland Park**

Part of the roofing above G Wing at Highland Park High School has reached the end of its useful life and is being replaced. The newly installed roofing, called EPDM, is made from an extremely durable and long-lasting synthetic rubber. This roofing is particularly effective in low-slope applications, like the flat roofs of our high school buildings.







### **Auditorium Renovation at DHS**

The renovation to the Auditorium at DHS began in earnest when students left for summer break in early June. The renovations include demolishing the existing ceiling and installing a new ceiling, replacing the catwalk, reinforcing steel and the stage area for new rigging, installing new seating and stage flooring, new lighting and AV upgrades, as well as a double height overhead door to accommodate large theater props.

Thus far, the concrete slab has been poured to provide an ADA-accessible entrance and ADA-compliant ramps throughout the space. Framing has been completed for new vestibules that will provide better acoustics by incorporating more sound attenuation for the Auditorium. Demolition of the existing ceiling will start in the next few weeks.

The project is on schedule and is expected to be completed in November.
