Senior Listening Project

The object of this project is to acquaint you with several styles of band playing and to give you the opportunity to hear university and professional ensembles playing at their best. It is hoped that this will help create an image in your mind of what we should be striving for in our band.

You will **listen to eight** excerpts from the Spotify playlist (or CD) and **choose three** to write about. For each selection you choose, answer the following three questions:

- How would you describe this piece? You may mention items such as style, tempo, dynamics, melodies, rhythms, tonality (major/minor) and featured instruments.
- What is one thing you find unique or interesting about this piece?
- What do you like or dislike about the piece or performance?

As a summary, discuss **two overall lessons** you learned that we could apply to our band.
