CLASSROOM POLICIES

These six simple guidelines will help us to have productive rehearsals and quality performances.

- 1. Be in your seat with your instrument and music ready when rehearsal begins <u>two minutes after the</u> bell.
- 2. Develop and practice your listening skills. Limit exercising your verbal skills.
- 3. Keep all devices turned off and put away. Phone caddies are available for students that need them or forget before rehearsal begins.
- 4. Have a sharpened pencil on your stand and use it to make notes in your music.
- 5. Keep a positive attitude & stay on task. Respect the opinions and ability levels of others in the class.
- 6. Practice your music outside of class so that you are prepared for rehearsals.

ATTENDANCE POLICIES

In order to perform our best, it is important to have everybody in class every day. Unauthorized absences will result in consequences from the deans and could result in being pulled from a performance. Refer to the student handbook for detailed information on school absence policies. An unauthorized absence from a performance will result in a grade reduction of up to 20%.

Included in this handbook is a calendar of events for the 2023-2024 school year. Use this information when planning work schedules and other outside commitments. Attendance at these performances is mandatory unless otherwise noted. Absences will only be authorized for illness, family travel, or family emergencies. A signed note from your parent/guardian stating the reason for missing a performance is required. When possible, notify Ms. Holt well in advance of any planned absence. Conflicts with other school activities will be managed by Ms. Holt and the other sponsor/coach. Absences will not be authorized for work.

LOCKERS

Each band student (except for percussionists and tuba players - optional) will be assigned an individual music locker for storing instruments, music and accessories. You must provide your own combination lock. The lockers are located in the hallways surrounding the band room. You need to keep them securely locked in order to prevent theft. Do not share your combination with others. You are responsible for any school-owned equipment that is lost or stolen from a band locker that you left unlocked.

GRADING

Your grade in band is based on your ability and achievement in these two categories:

Performance – tone, intonation, correct pitches, rhythm, notations, and style (plus improvisation for JB) Musicology – analysis, evaluation, history, and theory

In your band warm-up packet, you can find specific targets that we will work to achieve for each category. For example, the tone target is: "As a member of the ensemble or as a soloist, I can produce a good tone on my instrument." You will be assessed through playing tests, in-class performance, quizzes, papers, and self-evaluations. You are encouraged to retake any playing test or redo any paper to show improvement or better understanding and to receive a higher grade.

Your semester grade will be weighted as follows: Playing assessments - 45%

Rehearsal & Concert Reflections - 45%

Written work - 10%

When you take a playing test with Ms. Holt, you will receive your grade on the spot. Recorded playing tests will be graded within two weeks. Worksheets and quizzes will be graded within one week. There is no penalty for late assignments, but they will not be graded as quickly. There is no penalty for late playing tests, but they are more difficult to schedule. Contact Ms. Holt if you ever need an extension on an assignment or test.

CREDIT

Symphonic Band, Wind Ensemble, and Jazz Band members receive one full credit per semester. Concert Band members receive one half credit per semester as their time is shared with freshman advisory. All music classes are taken for regular credit. Any student in Wind Ensemble or Jazz Band who wishes to receive honors credit for the class may apply for the Honors Music program. This includes completing major project and extra performance requirements including a solo recital. The application deadline is the third Friday of each semester.

BAND CURRICULUM

The **Concert Band** curriculum is designed to teach and review fundamental musical concepts in two areas, performance and musicianship. Performance fundamentals include proper tone, intonation, rhythm, balance and expression. Students will work on scales, chorales and tuning exercises in addition to concert literature. Percussionists will learn rudiments and proper playing techniques for all of the drums, cymbals, timpani, keyboard percussion and accessories. Musicianship fundamentals include key signatures, transposition, musical terms, and the history of musical instruments. The literature performed by the Concert Band will include a wide variety of styles and composers. Students will perform at least one classical transcription, modern piece, lyrical work, overture and march throughout the year.

The **Symphonic Band/Wind Ensemble** curriculum is based on the repertoire best suited to the ensemble in a given year. In addition to reinforcing the performance and musicianship fundamentals studied in Concert Band, SB/WE members will explore the music of many cultures and composers, as well as highlighting the core works in the wind repertoire. This will be done through performing, listening and discussing pieces that relate to the given repertoire. All students will also have the opportunity to perform in a chamber ensemble for the Solo & Ensemble Festival in March.

The **Jazz Band** curriculum focuses on improvisation, jazz style and arranging. Students learn to improvise over various progressions including modal, blues, and ii-V-I patterns. We also study classic recordings and play transcriptions of solos by legendary jazz musicians.

EXTRACURRICULAR ENSEMBLES AND EVENTS

Unlike the curricular band classes (Concert Band, Symphonic Band, Wind Ensemble, and Jazz Band), these groups are extracurricular. Students who choose to participate in these activities should familiarize themselves with the Extracurricular Code and eligibility requirements. These may be found in the DHS student handbook.

The **Warrior Marching Band** is open to all band members. This group performs for varsity football games, parades, and the Band-O-Rama concert in the fall. Rehearsals include one week of preseason band camp, and two evening/after school rehearsals per week through the end of October.

Monday Afternoon Jazz is open to all DHS students who play an instrument. This group meets weekly from November to April. Emphasis is on learning proper jazz style and improvisation to prepare members for Jazz Band auditions. MAJ performs on two concerts each year. Sign up in early October.

Pep Band performs during the winter sport season during home varsity basketball games. The band is made up of students from all classes. Further details will be distributed in November.

OTHER EVENTS, PERFORMANCES, AND MUSIC OPPORTUNITIES

Solo and Ensemble Festival: DHS and HPHS combine to host our own festival in the spring each year. This provides an opportunity for student soloists and ensembles to perform for a judge and receive a rating and critique. Students enrolled in honors credit second semester are required to perform a solo during the Solo & Ensemble festival. Wind Ensemble, Symphonic & Concert Band students are strongly encouraged to participate in a solo and/or chamber ensemble. The **Percussion Festival Concert,** performed with our percussionist colleagues at Highland Park HS, New Trier HS & Evanston HS will be on the same day as the Solo & Ensemble festival this year! Please see the calendar for more details.

ILMEA District and State festivals: Students audition in October with other musicians from northeastern Illinois for placement in the district band and jazz bands. The top students from around the state are invited to participate in the All-State festival in January. Competition for spots in the district and state groups is very keen. The **Northshore Honor Band** is another honor group for nominated students. This group is selected based on recommendations from Ms. Holt, not audition. The festival takes place the first weekend back from winter break in January.

Private Lessons: The Chicagoland area teems with qualified private lesson instructors, and we work with a lot of them! We've recruited some of the best teachers in the area to work with our students and would like to see as many students as possible taking advantage of this great opportunity. Lessons taught at DHS are \$30/half hour lesson, paid directly to the teacher. They can be scheduled during a free period, before or after school, or during a student's band class period. *This is the best investment you can make in your playing ability!* Students will be introduced to the teachers that come to DHS in the first month of school, however a list of private teachers is available on the band website under Resources > Private Lessons.

Concert Attendance: The other area schools, <u>Northwestern University</u>, <u>Northern Illinois</u> <u>University</u>, <u>DePaul University</u> and community organizations provide excellent opportunities to hear high-quality performances, and they're low cost or often free of charge! There is also the <u>Chicago Symphony</u>, the <u>Chicago Civic Orchestra</u> and <u>Northshore Concert Band</u> that are easily some of the best ensembles in the nation, right around the corner! There will be many opportunities during the year for many interested band members to travel together with Ms. Holt to hear some of these outstanding ensembles. To understand good playing, it is important to HEAR good playing LIVE!

Summer Music Camps: Students at Deerfield are very involved and very busy during the school year. Summer musical study is a way to focus a student's attention upon this one aspect of their lives for a week or two during the summer months. There are many music camps of varying quality levels. There is a list on the band website under the Resources > Summer Camps. Registration for these often begins in January or February of each year. They range from three days to eight weeks, and are worth every penny!
