

Dear DHS Seniors and Families,



Graduation "Processional" (a.k.a. Car Route)

Graduates and their families will enter the campus at the North Entrance (near the athletic fields) and follow the route shown below. Security staff will be present to help guide vehicles during the graduation "processional." Cars will be positioned so that families can view their graduate walk across the stage to receive their diploma at the front circle.



Presentation of Diplomas

Graduates should come dressed in their caps and gowns to receive their diplomas. Graduates will exit their cars and walk across a decorated stage at the front circle to receive their diploma on stage.

We will have two photographers from Stuart Rodgers at this event to take pictures while students walk across the stage and receive their diploma. One photographer will take a picture as each student walks across the stage and the other will take a posed picture of each student with their diploma. For the posed picture, there will be a backdrop that says "Deerfield High School Class of 2020."
