Interpersonal Listening and Speaking in Spanish: Preparation for the Seal of Biliteracy

This course will help students develop the incredibly important (yet often challenging) interpersonal communication skills of listening and speaking in Spanish in preparation for the Seal of Biliteracy testing that takes place during fourth- and fifth-year Spanish. Areas of focus will include comprehensibility, transitioning from one idea to the next, narrating in the past, describing in the present, and discussing plans for the future. Students will also become more confident when dealing with unexpected developments in Spanish, asking questions, using the formal and familiar registers, and making strong arguments. This course will be taught ENTIRELY in Spanish.

Open to: Students who have Spanish III or Spanish III Honors, Spanish IV or Spanish IV Honors, Spanish IV Survey, Spanish V, AP Spanish Language and Culture, and/or AP Spanish Literature in their schedules for the 2024-2025 school year.

Credit: 1 Elective Credit; does NOT allow a student to skip ahead to the next level.

Cost: \$300 (\$400 Out of District), 2 Terms, 6 weeks, half day morning.
